Honors Expectations:

Honors classes will write an essay each week (either assigned or in-class), present current events/articles regularly, read additional novels each semester, and have differentiated/extended assignments for every novel studied. These may include, but are not limited to: full- length research papers, independent reading in conjunction with class texts, creative writing, and collaborative projects.

Tardy Policy

Grades

I believe grades are earned and not "given." While some aspects of grading student work in an English classroom are subjective in nature, I will always attempt to make my grading criteria clear for individual assignments and units. If you do not understand a particular set of criteria, please discuss it with me well in advance of the due date! Cheating and plagiarism will not be permitted and will result in an automatic zero! I do allow revision on failed essays. Students are allowed to revise up to three essays a semester. These revisions must be discussed with me within a week of receiving the assignment back. New due dates will be discussed on an individual basis.

Grades will be based off of a total points system. In- class assignments, homework, projects, tests, and participation points will each have an assigned value and will not be weighted. The final exam grade is worth 10% of the total semester grade, as per school policy.

Late Work/Absences

The nature of this course brings with it high expectations for performance. *All work is expected the day it is due*. If you are absent, you may turn in late work the day you return for full credit. Otherwise, all assignments turned in late will receive 10% off daily, up to 50 % of the assignment credit. **After 5 days, late assignments will not be accepted**.
