Movie Rational for *Inside Out* 

*Inside Out* zeroes in on one of the most poignant times in an individual's life, which is the transition to the preteen and early teen years. Pixar's film *Inside Out* is an animated fantasy that remains remarkably true to what scientists have learned about the mind, emotion and memory. The film is about an 11-year-old girl named Riley who moves from her happy home in Minnesota to the West Coast, where she has no friends and pizza is made with broccoli. Much of the film is spent inside Riley's mind, which features a control center manned by five personified emotions: Joy, Sadness, Fear, Anger and Disgust.
